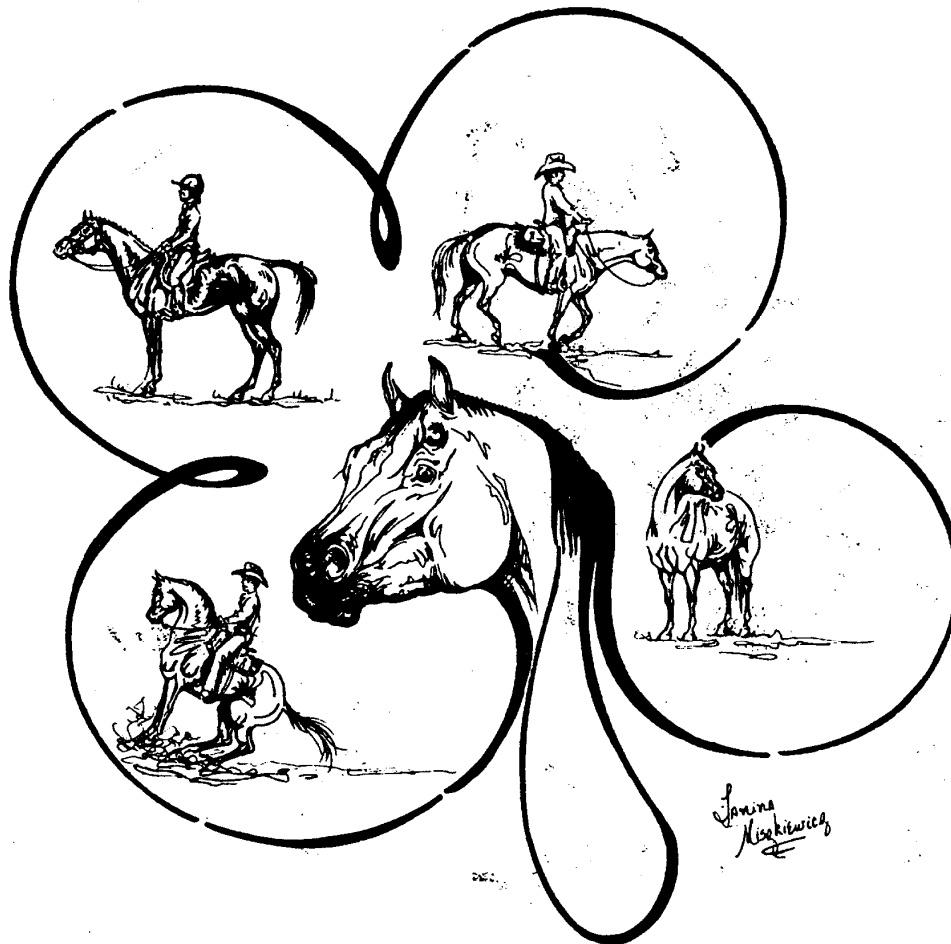


# SPOKANE COUNTY 4-H HORSE LIBRARY

Section Three give reference information. Section Four gives useful horsekeeping forms.

Apart from freak accidents injuries do not just happen. They are the end result of preventable problems. The author demonstrates techniques for detecting these problems through clinical observations and palpation. Correction of these injury prone conditions is then shown. Exercise programs, massage, suppling, and stretching are prescribed for various conditions.

# 1 – Highlights understanding the condition-response method; evaluating training techniques; developing the 'want to' attitude and attention span of your horse; using the horse's basic characteristics to your advantage; overcoming fear; exercises for nervous, high-headed horses; stop 'jigging' on trail; understanding the physical, mental and emotional make-up of the horse; and understanding what motivators and cues are.
